Entering a New Phase!

@St. Paul, October 16

On August 27, 2024, the newly formed Unified Parish Council (UPC) and Unified Finance Council (UFC) met at the St. Joseph Parish Center for their first meeting as representatives of the six parishes in the St. Gaspar Family of Parishes. This new group is composed of staff members, two parish council representatives, and two finance council representatives from all six parishes. As we move forward, these councils are tasked with helping us become one canonical parish under the name of St. Gaspar.

A decision was made to hold combined meetings where the UPC and UFC will first meet together before breaking into their respective groups. Meetings will occur every six weeks, and the goal is to keep them to 1.5 hours.

Fr. Tony Fortman clarified the roles of both councils. The Parish Council acts as a consultative body to assist with pastoral governance, while the Finance Council helps administer parish financial matters within Canon Law.

One of the major concerns is to develop ways to ensure effective communication among all six parishes, particularly in light of the goals established by the Next Generation Parish/Catholic Leadership Institute. On this end, the minutes from the meeting that took place on August 27 are now available online at <u>stgasparfamily.org</u>. We encourage everyone to review them for a deeper understanding of the discussions.





Increase in Ohio Abortions From Dayton Right to Life

[T]he Ohio Department of Health [recently] released its 2023 killing of the preborn report. As expected, the state and local numbers are horrific. Net increases were reported across the board and in almost every geographical area. Keep in mind, for most of 2023, the state and local courts effectively stifled the Heartbeat law under injunctions, while lawmakers just threw up their hands and carefully positioned themselves for the 2024 and 2025 election cycles.

Issue 1, the abortion constitutional amendment, was passed by 2 million Ohioans in November 2023. Two million votes are hardly a "mandate" from a state of over 11 million residents. However, the media and others would like you to think it was an overwhelming statement of support. This report is a glimpse into the future of Ohio now that the constitutional amendment is in place and most safeguards have been dismantled. As a reminder, these numbers only reflect the surgical abortions (not most pill/chemical abortions) as reported by the abortionists themselves. With the absence of such reporting, the true number of babies lost is much, much higher. In Ohio, of the 22,000 children reported killed in the womb:

87% were Ohio residents76% were 12 weeks or younger43.9% were black62% had siblings

In Montgomery County, 4,283 [82 per week] children were killed in their mothers' wombs. This number is only 2nd behind, the state's deadliest location of Cleveland. Montgomery County, specifically, the Kettering abortuary murdered more children than Hamilton (Cincinnati), Franklin (Columbus), and Lucas (Toledo) counties.

Of the children killed in Montgomery, only 31% were Montgomery County residents, making this facility THE abortion destination for Southwest Ohio. Mothers from West Virginia, Indiana, Kentucky and across Ohio travel to the Kettering abortuary for "services."

Because the state only reports on residents, we know nothing about the 2,946 children who were brought to Kettering for their last breaths. Of the 1,337 children killed by mothers residing in Montgomery County, 55% were black, though black mothers make up only 13% of the population of Montgomery County.

"This is the true health crisis in Montgomery County. If 82 children died each week from gun violence, the city and local leaders would be demanding action and change. Yet the lives of these children are not only ignored, they are not even mourned or acknowledged. This community is losing generations of citizens, and the silence is deafening." says Margie Christie, Executive Director Dayton Right to Life. "For those of us in the prolife community, we are not surprised, only heartbroken and grieving. We hear the suffering women's stories, we see their emergency room reports, and we see the devastating effects this daily loss of life has had on our area." she adds.
