

Emmanuel Designated as a Jubilee Site

In the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, three locations have been designated as Jubilee Pilgrimage Sites: the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Peter in Chains, the Shrine of the Holy Relics at Maria Stein, and Emmanuel Catholic Church in Dayton. A pilgrimage visit to any of these sites can apply to the reception of the Jubilee Indulgence.

What is a Jubilee?

In Catholic tradition, a jubilee is a Holy Year — a special year of forgiveness, reconciliation, and hope. Every 25 years, in accordance with ancient tradition, the Pope proclaims a Jubilee year. Following St. Paul's words to the Romans, "Hope does not disappoint" (*Rom* 5:5), the central message of the upcoming Jubilee is hope. And as part of the Year of Jubilee 2025, Pope Francis has granted special indulgences the faithful can obtain so that we can both give, as well as receive, the forgiveness, reconciliation, and hope we all need from the Hand of God.

What is an indulgence?

"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven..."

"An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin." "The faithful can gain indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead." [Catechism of the Catholic Church 1471]

What are the conditions for receiving a Plenary Indulgence?

- (1) Perform the indulgenced work (see below for specific Jubilee Indulgenced works);
- (2) Have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;
- (3) Have sacramentally confessed your sins;
- (4) Receive the Holy Eucharist;
- (5) Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father (an Our Father and Hail Mary is suggested).

It is appropriate that Sacramental Confession, Holy Communion, and the prayers for the Pope's intentions take place on the same day as the indulgenced work; but they can be done within 20 days before or after the indulgenced act. One Sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.

What works can be done to obtain a Jubilee Indulgence?

Indulgenced works for the Jubilee include pilgrimages and works of mercy and penance.

Pilgrimages:

The faithful can obtain a Jubilee Indulgence by piously visiting a sacred Jubilee site and devoutly participating in Holy Mass or <u>any</u> of the following: (1) a celebration of the Word of God; (2) the Liturgy of the Hours (Office of Readings, Lauds, Vespers); (3) the Via Crucis (Way of the Cross); (4) the Marian Rosary; (5) a penitential celebration which ends with the individual confessions; (6) Eucharistic Adoration and meditation for a "suitable period of time" concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith in any legitimate form, and invocations to Mary, the Mother of God.

Works of mercy and penance:

A Jubilee Indulgence can also be obtained by the faithful who, with a devout spirit, participate in: (1) popular missions, spiritual exercises, or formation activities on the documents of the Second Vatican Council and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, (2) works of charity or mercy (i.e., the corporal and spiritual works of mercy) by visiting their brothers and sisters who are in need or in difficulty (the sick, prisoners, lonely elderly people, disabled people...), or (3) (i) by abstaining in a spirit of penance at least one day a week, in a concrete and generous way from futile distractions (e.g., social media), (ii) by refraining from superfluous consumption (e.g. fasting or abstinence), (iii) by donating a proportionate sum of money to the poor, (iv) by supporting works of a religious or social nature, especially in support of the defense and protection of life in all its phases, or (v) by dedicating a reasonable portion of time acts of service to the community.

What if I can't do any of those?

The faithful who are truly repentant of sin but who cannot participate in any of the above for serious reasons, can obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if they recite the Our Father, the Profession of Faith in any approved form, and other prayers in conformity with the objectives of the Holy Year, in their homes or wherever they are confined.

Extraordinary grace!!

During the Jubilee Year you can obtain two plenary indulgences per day! Despite the rule that only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day, the Pope has decreed that during the Jubilee, faithful who perform an act of charity on behalf of the Poor Souls in Purgatory and receive Holy Communion a second time that same day, can obtain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the deceased. The reception of Communion must take place within a Eucharistic celebration (i.e., Holy Mass or a Communion Service).

DECREE DESIGNATING SACRED JUBILEE SITES

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

hereas, the Holy Father FRANCIS, BISHOP OF ROME, has decreed that the Holy Door of the Basilica of Saint Peter in the Vatican will be opened on Tuesday, December 24, 2024, inaugurating the ORDINARY JUBILEE of the YEAR 2025 with the theme Pilgrims of Hope (Spes non confundit, 6); and

Whereas, the Holy Father FRANCIS, has further decreed that each diocesan bishop throughout the Church is to solemnly open the HOLY YEAR in the local Church with the celebration of Holy Mass in the cathedral on Sunday, December 29, 2024 (*ibid.*); and

Whereas, the Holy Father FRANCIS desires to set forth the Jubilee Indulgence as a gift for "discovering the unlimited nature of God's mercy" (Spes non confundit, 23) as a special Jubilee grace and has directed the Apostolic Penitentiary to set forth norms for obtaining the Jubilee Indulgence; and

hereas, within said norms it is laid out that the diocesan bishop may establish SACRED JUBILEE SITES within his jurisdiction to which the faithful can undertake a pious pilgrimage or make a pious visit, which when completed along with the usual conditions, i.e. being "moved by a spirit of charity and ... [being] purified through the sacrament of penance and refreshed by Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff" (Decree on the Granting of the Indulgence During the Ordinary Jubilee Year 2025), afford for obtaining a PLENARY INDULGENCE for oneself or a soul in Purgatory;

I, therefore,

DENNIS M. SCHNURR ARCHBISHOP OF CINCINNATI,

having weighed the spiritual benefits for the People of God, hereby decree

on this Fourth Day of December 2024

that for the period of the ORDINARY JUBILEE of the YEAR 2025

the CATHEDRAL BASILICA of SAINT PETER in CHAINS in Cincinnati, Ohio;

the MARIA STEIN SHRINE of the HOLY RELICS in Maria Stein, Ohio; and

the parish church of EMMANUEL in Dayton, Ohio

be designated as

SACRED JUBILEE SITES

wherefrom the faithful through

DIVINE GRACE

will experience the hope offered from forgiveness and "hearts and minds open to the need to *forgive others* in turn" (Spes non confundit, 23).

Communication Guidelines for the New Year

Bulletin Guidelines: St. Gaspar Family of Parishes

Deadline:

All bulletin submissions are due by 12:00 pm on Thursday, ten days prior to the intended Sunday publication. Ministry leaders should send their submissions directly to the Communications Manager Joan Macpherson via email: jmacpherson@preciousbloodchurch.org. If assistance is needed for electronic submissions please contact the Communications Manager to make special arrangements.

Complete Information Required:

Submissions must include all necessary details in a complete and ready to publish format. Ministries should avoid sending informal or vague requests like, "Please announce our meeting." Instead, they should provide a fully written post that requires no further revision.

Format:

Submissions must be sent electronically in a ready to publish format. Text should be included in the body of the email or attached as a Word document. If any additional design elements (images, logos) are needed, these must be included in the email and labeled appropriately.

Revisions and Edits:

The bulletin editor will only make minor edits for clarity, style, or space. Submissions requiring significant revision will be returned to the sender for resubmission. The deadline will still apply.

Recurring Events:

Monthly Submissions Required: Even if an event occurs every month, ministry leaders must submit a new bulletin request by the deadline for each month they want the event included. Yearly Recurring Submissions: Ministry leaders can submit a yearly schedule for recurring events at the start of the year or as soon as their schedule is confirmed.

General Bulletin Guidelines:

Faith Based Focus: We do not share events that are not related to our Catholic faith. All announcements must align with the mission and values of the St. Gaspar Family of Parishes.

Word Count: Announcements should not exceed 100 words unless otherwise approved.

Repetitions: Announcements may be repeated for up to 3 consecutive weeks when space allows.

The primary purpose of the bulletin is to evangelize and promote parish life. Every ministry and event needs to have a point person who will submit content for the bulletin. The following items receive priority in this order:

Liturgical Services:

- Mass times
- Major feast days and celebrations

Sacramental Preparation:

- First Communion, Confirmation, Marriage preparation, and RCIA schedules
- Registration deadlines for sacramental preparation

Spiritual Growth Opportunities:

• Retreats, days of reflection, Bible study groups, faith formation classes

Key Parish Events:

- Parish wide events

Parish Ministries & Volunteer Opportunities:


