

From the Pastor's Desk

While Fr. Tony continues to recover, we express our gratitude for the presence of our Parochial Vicar, Fr. Jim Gaynor, who will be sharing a reflection with us today:

Being True to Our Faith

How dedicated are we to our faith and to living in a Christ like way? We find in Mathew's Gospel indications that Jesus knew God the Father's plan for the humanity He had created. It was to be: A brotherly humanity, but Jesus found people going to worship in the temple angry and vengeful and He teaches: if you bring your gift to the altar and there recall that your brother has something against you, go first to be reconciled to your brother and then offer your gift. (Mt. 5,21)

It was to be a humanity faithful to it's word, but Jesus found men dismissing a wife and taking another and He says clearly that is adultery and wrong. When you mean yes, say yes and when no, you say no. (Mt. 5,31-37). It was to be a humanity created in the image and likeness of God the Father, but He found people seeking to return injury for injury, an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth and He says: your heavenly Father caused the sun to rise on the bad and the good, He rains on the just and unjust. My commandment is love your enemies (Mt. 5, 43)

It was to be a humanity always thankful and attentive to their creator, dedicating space and time to him. In contrast, Jesus found that space which was the temple of Jerusalem dedicated to money changing and selling and buying of animals. He entered the temple and drove out all those engaged in buying and selling. (Mt. 21,12)

To what extent would Jesus go to rectify humanity. In today's part of Matthew's Gospel, He began to show his disciples that: He must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests and scribes and be killed and on the third day be raised. (Mt.16,21).

Where must we go today, being true to our faith and to Christian living? We must respect life and promote respect for life, even though it might be going contrary to the political winds of our time.


"I'm Grateful It Happened."

Keshawn was 22 when his mom left him at St. Vincent's men's shelter. "I was still a kid," he says. "I was scared, and didn't know why I was there." He had been abused physically and emotionally all his life, made to feel worthless and incapable of accomplishing anything. When he was left to fend for himself in shelter, away from the negative influence of his family, he began to discover himself.

"Shelter helped me grow as a person," he says. "God was readjusting and repositioning me. I had to learn to go with the flow. God told me so many times to never give up." He finally found a home with St. Vincent's supportive housing where he is now working toward his goals and continuing to heal from his past. "It was tough," he says of shelter, "but it's all about your mindset. I'm grateful it happened."

Updates from Catholic Social Services of the Miami Valley

Empowering Children with Hope & Opportunity (ECHO)

ECHO is a comprehensive program designed to remove nonacademic barriers to learning for students in grades K-12. The University of Dayton developed this model for area Catholic schools, and we're partnering with UD to use ECHO in rural public schools.

For the 2023-24 school year, we're in two Shelby County school districts: Houston and Russia. Our ECHO programming includes a social and emotional learning curriculum, in-school counseling sessions for referred students, professional development for teachers, and case management services for at-risk families.

Making individual counseling accessible to the kids is particularly meaningful because suicide is now the second leading cause of



death for youth ages 14 to 24. Dayton Children's Hospital reported that more than 7,000 children and teens were treated at the emergency and crisis center in 2022, and for those who were admitted to the hospital, the number one reason was suicidal thoughts. By making counseling a standard activity available at school, we hope to normalize the idea of kids talking with a counselor when they're feeling overwhelmed or need help facing life's challenges.


