



Cardinal Ratzinger gave this homily on April 18, 2005. We must not remain children in faith, in the condition of minors. And what does it mean to be children in faith? St Paul answers: it means being "tossed here and there, carried about by every wind of doctrine" (Eph 4: 14).

This description is very timely!

How many winds of doctrine have we known in recent decades, how many ideological currents, how many ways of thinking. The small boat of many Christian thoughts has often been tossed about by these waves - flung from one extreme to another: from Marxism to liberalism, even to libertinism; from collectivism to radical individualism; from atheism to a vague religious mysticism; from agnosticism to syncretism and so forth. Every day new sects spring up, and what St Paul says about human deception and the trickery that strives to entice people into error (cf. Eph 4: 14) comes true.

Today, having a clear faith based on the Creed of the Church is often labeled as fundamentalism. Whereas relativism, that is, letting oneself be "tossed here and there, carried about by every wind of doctrine", seems the only attitude that can cope with modern times. We are building a dictatorship of relativism that does not recognize anything as definitive and

whose ultimate goal consists solely of one's own ego and desires.

Jesus tells us in today's gospel that He is the bread of life. We must eat His body and drink His blood in order to have life within us. The bread and wine is consecrated at Mass. It is then turned into the body and blood of Jesus. Other people may tell you different beliefs about the Eucharist. We know that we possess the body and blood of Jesus in our Catholic Church. This is not being arrogant. If we don't believe this or if we don't teach this, then we will raise up a generation that does not believe in the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This may hurt others in the Christian faith but do we abdicate our beliefs in order to make people feel good? People are hungry for true faith and doctrine. As Catholics, we need to give people a foundation to stand on. When you have a question, go to the source. Go to the catechism. We are not to leave people hanging. Jesus reveals everything about His Father to us. He does not hide anything. We are not to hide our faith. God bless you, Fr. Tony Fortman, C.PP.S.

Fall Brings Rich Opportunities for Faith and Fellowship in the St. Gaspar Family of Parishes

This fall, the St. Gaspar Family of Parishes is offering a rich array of faith enrichment and fellowship opportunities for all ages. The season kicks off with the introduction of a Family Rosary and Potluck at St. Joseph Parish Center on the last Sunday of each month, beginning August 25. Families are invited to gather in prayer and enjoy a meal together, creating a nurturing environment for spiritual growth and community bonding. Additionally, a Minister of Care Workshop at St. Joseph Parish Center on August 24, led by Deacon David Shea, will equip volunteers to bring the Eucharist to the homebound, emphasizing the importance of this ministry in maintaining connections with those unable to attend Mass. To add to the excitement, St. Joseph Parish will also host a Celebration Street Party on September 15, featuring music, games, food trucks, and fun for the whole family.

For those interested in deepening their understanding of Catholic teachings, several book studies and programs will be available. Starting August 27, PrayerMates at Precious Blood Parish will incorporate the classic spiritual work "Spiritual Combat" by Lorenzo Scupoli into their meetings. On August 29, a Thursday evening book study on "Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist" by Brant Pitre will begin, offering insights into the connections between Jewish traditions and the Christian Eucharist. In addition, the "Depolarizing Within" workshop on September 9 at Bainbridge Hall will help participants explore how to engage in more compassionate and nonpolarizing dialogue within the context of their faith. Furthermore, on September 21, Precious Blood Church will host a Day of Reflection titled "The Eucharist as Unifying Source." Led by Sr. Joyce Ann Zimmerman and organized by the Sisters of the Precious Blood and the Precious Blood Spirituality Institute, this event will focus on the Eucharist as a force that unites us, offering discussions, dialogue, and prayer throughout the day.

Holy Trinity Parish will host several fall faith formation programs starting in September, catering to different age groups and interests. The Family Formation program will take place on Sunday mornings, offering classes on Scripture and Catholic teachings for children, youth, and adults. For those seeking more in-depth study, the "Unlocking the Mysteries of the Bible" series will be available, along with other scripture and topic studies. Additionally, "Lunch with the Lord," a weekly Bible study, will provide a space for midweek spiritual reflection. These diverse offerings provide ample opportunities for parishioners to grow in their faith and foster a deeper sense of community throughout the fall season.
