

Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday. On this day, the lambs were being led into Jerusalem. These lambs would be used for the sacrifice of the Passover. Jesus is the Lamb of God, who was led into Jerusalem also, who will be a sacrifice for all of us. In order for something to live, something has to die. Sin carries a very high price tag. There needs to be a payment for it. Jesus' precious blood is the payment for our sins.

Just as the lambs blood, which was used to put on the door posts of the Hebrew people in Egypt, so the angel death would pass by their home, so Christ's blood protects us from death. 

Ever wonder why the deacon assisting at Mass offers the faithful the Precious Blood of Christ rather than the Host? The guidelines of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops for Masses with a deacon say that the deacon "assists the priest celebrant in distributing Communion, especially as minister of the precious blood" and that "if Communion is given under both kinds, the deacon ministers the chalice." While there may be pastoral reasons to adjust this practice, deacons serving as ministers of the chalice is the norm.

Holy Trinity Tenebrae

The Tenebrae service is an annual tradition at Holy Trinity. Following the Noon Stations of the Cross, we will pray a Scriptural Rosary together.

At 1:00 pm, we will gather for our distinctive Tenebrae service—a solemn and dramatic liturgy unique to Holy Trinity, marked by the gradual extinguishing of candles to symbolize the death of Christ. All are encouraged to join us for this moving expression of faith and reflection.

The Sacred Triduum

The Paschal Triduum is the most solemn and sacred time of the liturgical year, commemorating the Passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. It begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening and concludes with celebrating the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night.

Mass Changes During the Triduum

Some of our regular Mass times change, so please note the schedule. One key change is the absence of morning Masses on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. The absence of morning Masses during these days allows the faithful to enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ's Passion and death.

Only One Mass on Holy Saturday

Holy Saturday is a day of silence and waiting as the Church contemplates Christ's descent into the realm of the dead. We will have one Easter Vigil, at Precious Blood beginning at 8:45 pm. Going forward we will alternate between Emmanuel and Precious Blood.




Spring Campaign Ends

RIGHT TO LIFE

Every Child IS Wanted!

A 23-page guide from the National Right to Life Committee, *When They Say. . .You Say*, lays out detailed refutations to five categories of proabortion arguments.

The third category of arguments declare that every child should be a "wanted child", and claim that any social problems of the mother make the child unwanted. They say that abortion is the solution to poverty or abuse but, in reality, killing the child does not address the social issues.

"A poor mother is still poor the day after her child is aborted."

An abused mother still returns to an abusive situation after the abortion. Such social arguments for abortion should be countered with information on the services provided by pregnancy resource centers, and the large numbers of couples waiting to adopt babies, including babies with medical problems.

Hymnary.org has this interesting tale regarding our Palm Sunday processional, "All Glory, Laud, and Honor": "Theodulph, bishop of Orleans, wrote this text around 820 while he was imprisoned at Angers, France, for conspiring against King Louis the Pious. A probably apocryphal story from the early sixteenth century states that in a Palm Sunday procession King Louis passed the prison in which Theodulph was housed and heard the imprisoned bishop singing this hymn. According to the legend the king was so moved that he freed Theodulph and decreed the singing of 'All Glory, Laud, and Honor' on all subsequent Palm Sundays."
