

On the Road

Third Sunday of Easter Reflection

"Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So Jesus went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight.

(St. Luke 24: 29 – 31)

These two frightened and weary disciples, fleeing Jerusalem, on the road to Emmaus, urged this intriguing and beguiling man now walking with the , to 'stay with them' as night was falling. This peace-filled man joins them in fellowship at a supper inside an inn. He takes simple bread, says the blessing to "I AM" over the bread, breaks it, and distributes the bread to them. With this mysterious and enlightening action, their eyes are opened: "It is the Lord!" We are like those weary and frightened disciples on the road to "our own Emmaus". We have already witnessed fears and uncertainties in our road toward full collaboration and unity as the St. Gaspar Family of Parishes. But, we are met "on this road" by a Man, who just happens to meet us along the way. He asks us what we are talking about – and where we are going. We urge Him to stay with us --- for we are nearing a "night of distress". He stays with us.

He opens the Scriptures for us so that "our hearts are burning within us". The Man then takes the simple loaf of bread, blesses His Father for it, breaks it --- and gives It to us. We see clearly now: "It is the Lord!" Alleluia !!!!

The Risen Jesus does indeed raise us up to new Hope and Joy by opening the Scriptures to us --- and sharing his precious Body and Blood with us. Alleluia !!!

We are not alone on this road to our Emmaus. The Lord strengthens us, leads us forward in Hope and resurrection Grace. Jesus also "opens up" the glorious vision of his resurrected Body found among each of us --- loved sisters and brothers in this "Family". And what a glorious vision it is! We are one in Baptism and Faith in our Lord!





Pipe Organ Project Update From the Organ Builder, Nicholas Koch

@St. Joseph Church

Progress continues steadily on the pipe organ build. The facade blueprint has been refined—dimensions have been removed, and the pedal tower has been mirrored to better illustrate the intended configuration. Please note that the center pipes are not shown in this



version due to time constraints. In the workshop, several key ranks have undergone significant progress: The Great 8' Gemshorn rank has been carefully reassembled with new stainless steel tuning collars. Each pipe has been precisely fitted to the rackboard to ensure a perfectly vertical standing position.

The Great 4' Octave rank (pictured on the left) has also received new tuning collars and has been fully fitted to its rack board.


All other ranks have now been racked as well, with the exception of a few remaining bass ranks. More updates to come as work progresses!

Notes from Emmanuel's Choir Loft

For most of us, the words to our processional today will sound familiar, as it takes its text from our Easter Sequence, "Victimae Paschali Laudes" (Christians, to the Paschal Victim). This text, attributed to Wipo of Burgandy (d. 1050), is over a thousand years old. Like the sequence itself (indeed, all sequences), the poetic words foster deeper contemplation of Scripture; in this case, of course, the Mary mentioned is Mary Magdalene, who carried the Good News to the disciples.

Participating in the Mass Lord, Teach Us to Pray

Verbal Prayers and their Beauty

"Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples'. Jesus said to them, 'When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

The Encounter Team – after inviting you to call upon the Holy Spirit's power and wisdom, in order to open your heart and soul to prayer – now focuses on verbal prayer and its beauty and simplicity. As children and youth, we were taught the traditional Catholic prayers of intercession, praise,

thanksgiving, and worship: the Our Father, the Hail Mary, the Glory Be, the Apostle's Creed, and the Rosary. These all laid the foundation for us to center our lives entirely on Jesus and his death and Resurrection – on the will of God, our Father, Abba or "Daddy" - and on the trusting obedience and love of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. We urge you to continue to use these beautiful and life-giving prayers to "grow your Faith" - like the parable of the tiny mustard seed growing into a very large bush that even the birds can nest in. The Encounter Team also encourages you to build upon family verbal prayers said together at mealtime, bedtime, and at special events taking place in our lives: births, deaths, baptisms, weddings, and life transitions - such as leaving for college or getting a new job.

The Venerable, Fr. Patrick Peyton (1909 - 1992) always repeated: "The family that prays together, stays together."

We also joyfully celebrate the Mass – and the Eucharist, which is the 'source and summit of the Christian life'. The verbal prayers of all of us at Mass - and those responding to / with our priest and deacon - again center us on the intense love of our Father "spoken" in his beloved Son, Jesus Christ – the "Word made Flesh". We fully enter into the death and Resurrection of Christ.

We urge you to read over – and to lovingly pray over – the liturgical prayers used at the Mass, especially the Eucharistic Prayers said by the priest. These are both very beautiful, majestic, and full of mystery. We are united in Christ!

We invite you to explore the full treasury of Catholic prayers – and to use them as solid foundations for your growing Faith. Come, O Holy Spirit, come !



Saint of the Month

St. Joan of Arc (1412–1431)

Feast Day: May 30 Patroness of: Soldiers, France, those who suffer for their faith "I am not afraid... I was born to do this." — St. Joan of Arc

A peasant girl from Domrémy, France, Joan received visions of St. Michael, St. Catherine, and St. Margaret instructing her to drive the English from France. At just 17, she led French troops to major victories during the Hundred Years' War. Captured and condemned for her faith and gender, she was burned at the stake in 1431. Joan was canonized in 1920.

We invite you to emulate St. Joan's heroic faith: Speak truth with love. Stand firm in your beliefs. Act with boldness in kindness. Trust in God's voice over fear.
